## The World's top University – Cambridge University

The University of Cambridge is a collegiate public research university in Cambridge, United Kingdom. Founded in 1209 and granted a royal charter by King Henry III in 1231, Cambridge is the second-oldest university in the English-speaking world and the world's fourth-oldest surviving university. The university grew out of an association of scholars who left the University of Oxford after a dispute with the townspeople. The two "ancient universities" share many common features and are often referred to jointly as "Oxbridge".







Cambridge is formed from a variety of institutions which include 31 semi-autonomous constituent Colleges and over 100 academic departments organised into six schools. As of 2019, Cambridge is the top-ranked university in the United Kingdom according to all major league tables. It is a member of numerous associations and forms part of the "golden triangle" of English universities. The university has educated many notable alumni, including eminent mathematicians, scientists, politicians, lawyers, philosophers, writers, actors, monarchs and other heads of state. As of October 2019, 120 Nobel Laureates, 11 fields Medalists, 7 Turing Award winners and 14 British Prime Ministers have been affiliated with Cambridge as students, alumni, faculty or research staff. University alumni have won 194 Olympic medals.





## Brief introduction




The short term psychology program is taught by Cambridge professor, and the teaching is carried out by practice, lectures and interviews. People without academic background are also welcome to participate in the program, but good English level is required.

D4 WED		<p>Morning: Study at Cambridge University — Psychological Statistics Psychological statistics is a branch of Applied Statistics, it studies how to collect, organize and analyze digital data in psychological experiments, and how to make scientific inferences based on the information transmitted by these data.</p> <p>Visit <b>King's College</b>, the most famous college of Cambridge University. The Late Gothic King's College Chapel is one of the architectural highlights of Cambridge. Begun in 1446 and completed in stages over the following century, Wordsworth called it "an immense and glorious work of fine intelligence." The chapel's many treasures include rare early 16th-century windows, exquisite fan vaulting, a Renaissance wooden screen, and a painting by Rubens.</p>	host family

It is thus concerned with brain cells, brain structures and components, brain chemistry, and how all this leads to speech and action. It is also, of course, important to understand how we take in information from our five senses.</p> <p>Afternoon: Visit <b>Museum of Zoology</b>. With thousands of specimens on display, the museum offers a fascinating insight into the wonders of animal life.</p>	host family

D10 TUE		<p>Afternoon: Study at Cambridge University——Personality Psychology Personality psychology is one of the branches of psychology, which can be simply defined as the study of a person’s unique behaviour patterns.</p> <p>Afternoon: Visit <b>Ely</b>, a beautiful town, only 15 minutes by train from Cambridge to Ely. The City of Ely offers a wonderful blend of the historic and the modern. Take your time to wander and enjoy the sights or do something energetic or just sit and watch the world go by.
